This legislation supported the rapid growth of the nationwide network of Meals On Wheels programs that collectively serve more than 247 million meals to over 2.8 million seniors each year.

Single-Family Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program! MAG's new Single-Family Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program is here to assist residents with critical home repair and rehabilitation needs to keep our region's housing stock safe, accessible, and affordable. This program is geared toward rural communities, including Summit and Wasatch Counties and parts of Utah County. Eligible repairs and projects include roof replacement, wheel-chair accessible ramps, bringing electrical work up to code, increasing livable space to reduce overcrowding, and many more.


Small Business Loans

MAG Regional Planning:

WASATCH BACK RURAL PLANNING ORGANIZATION

MAG staff are excited to announce the creation of a new multi-county transportation planning forum for Wasatch and Summit Counties called the Wasatch Back Rural Planning Organization (RPO). The Wasatch Back RPO is a voluntary organization made up of nonmetropolitan communities and transportation officials that work together to identify transportation needs, create long-range transportation plans and priorities, and support other transportation and related planning efforts and processes.



For years, MAG staff has worked with the communities in Wasatch County, and UDOT Region 3 staff, to develop a transportation plan for that area. Many great projects have come from that process including the Heber Valley Corridor, where an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is currently being conducted. In early 2022, Summit County officials requested that MAG staff develop an RPO for their region. As these two regions continue to grow together, a joint Wasatch Back RPO that includes both counties and both UDOT Regions (Region 2 and Region 3) became the preferred model. MAG staff is working with the member jurisdictions to finalize the development of the Wasatch Back RPO. We anticipate the first meeting will be held early this year.

The Wasatch Back RPO will provide a forum for local government leaders to come together and collaborate to achieve their vision for the future of the region. MAG staff will administer the RPO and are excited about the opportunity the RPO will provide to these communities.



Map Of The Quarter: Corridor Preservation

Check out MAG's new <u>Corridor Preservation story-map</u>. The story-map offers information on the planning and acquisition process that we use to preserve corridors for future transportation projects.

Corridor preservation allows for enhanced capacity of existing transportation corridors or to protect proposed corridors in advance of the need for and commencement of the transportation facility construction. Corridor preservation is a tool for long-range transportation planning rather than a strategy for meeting present highway project needs.
